Review of Nova Scotia Code Changes

Nova Scotia has introduced changes to the NBC and NPC. In reviewing these changes, I believe the following items may need attention or should be considered by the industry or manufacturers involved in heating and plumbing.

These are highlights of the major items and not comprehensive in any way. The intent of this summary is to give a “head’s up” notice of items that the industry should pay attention to because the rules of the game are changing.

It should be noted that the Nova Scotia changes are additional to those in the NBC and NPC. This has the effect of having to meet additional objectives or new functional statements.
